Joint Masters in Religious Education Primary

The Masters in Religious Education (MREd) is jointly hosted by the Mater Dei Institute of Education and St Patrick's College, Drumcondra, both colleges of Dublin City University, the awarding body.

The Programme focuses on Religious Education and Catechetics in respect of the child of primary school age. This is reflected in the rich range of modules on offer that cover such areas as education, religious education, theology, sacraments, scripture, ecclesiology and major World Religions.

Graduates will demonstrate the ability to take on significant responsibility in the area of Religious Education at the primary level. Upon successful completion of the programme the graduate will be able to demonstrate:

- a systematic and comprehensive understanding of the theology and pedagogic theory involved in the Religious Education of primary school children
- an enhanced critical sensitivity to the psychological, sociological, religious, ethical and political issues raised by the teaching of religion at primary level
- a command of tools of research, including writing skills, in the areas of theology and pedagogic inquiry, especially as these bear on the teaching of religion at primary level
- the particular skills necessary to address the issues that arise in the creation, management and implementation of programmes of Religious Education in the primary sector

Career Prospects

Many who have received this qualification have continued teaching but a significant number of graduates now occupy positions as Diocesan Advisors in primary school religious education, college lecturers, DES inspectors, principals in schools and other leadership positions. In addition, graduates of the programme have contributed to publications in the area of primary religious education, given lectures to various parish groups and they have organised and delivered religious education courses for teachers.

Who is this Master's programme for?

The programme contributes to on-going professional development. In the main, MREd students are primary teachers who wish to:

- enhance the way they teach religious education to primary school children
- create and promote inclusive classroom practice
- promote a better understanding of faith development in the classroom environment
- engage in the teaching of Education about Religions and Beliefs (ERB)
- improve their own understanding of the relationship between Religious Education, Catechetics and Education
- develop their skills in contemporary methods of Religious Education
- employ methods of Digital Pedagogy in teaching and learning
- enhance their career opportunities in the Education Sector
- enrich themselves intellectually and spiritually

Resources

MREd students enrol in alternate years in one of the Colleges but are entitled to use the library and IT facilities in both.

Flexible Scheduling

The programme is offered: **Part-time** (two years, normally) **Full-time** (one year)

Typically, the programme is taught two evenings per week to facilitate teachers. Students will also attend two Saturdays during the academic year to assist with practical research skills.





Modules

Participants complete 6 modules (10 credits each) and a Thesis Research module (30 credits).


