Jesus is Risen The Empty Tomb


The Women at the Tomb (Mt 28:1-10)

After the Sabbath, as Sunday morning was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb. Suddenly, an angel of the Lord came down from heaven, rolled the stone away, and sat on it. His clothes were white as snow. The angel spoke to the women. 'You must not be afraid,' he said. 'I know you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has been raised, just as he said ... Go quickly now, and tell his disciples, "He has been raised from death, and now he is going to Galilee ahead of you; there you will see him!"

So they left the tomb in a hurry, afraid and yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples. Suddenly Jesus met them and said, 'Peace be with you.' They came up to him, took hold of his feet, and worshipped him. 'Do not be afraid,' Jesus said to them. 'Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me.'

- Can you describe the angel that is mentioned in this scripture story?
- Why did the angel tell Mary Magdalene and the other Mary not to be afraid?
- Where did the angel tell them to go?
- What did Jesus say to Mary Magdalene and the other Mary when he met them?



- How do you think Mary Magdalene and the other Mary might have felt as they were walking to the tomb that morning?
- How do you think they felt when they saw that Jesus' body was no longer there?
- Can you think why Mary Magdalene and the other Mary would have been both afraid and yet filled with joy as they ran to tell the disciples about the empty tomb?
- What might you have done if you were with them that morning?
- Did Jesus want people to know that he was alive? How do you know?

Do you have any questions?

- What might you have said if you were at the tomb that morning? How do you think you might have felt?
- What prayer would you like to pray?
- Can you draw an image of that morning?
- Can you imagine what happened when Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to Galilee and told the others what and who they saw?
