4 JANUARY 2022 - World Braille Day




World Braille Day is observed on January 4 to honour the birth of Braille's inventor, Louis Braille (1809-1852).

6 JANUARY 2022 - World Day of War Orphans

12 JANUARY 2022 - National Youth Day



Swami Vivekananda was born on 12 January, 1863. Today is designated National Youth Day because the philosophy of Swami and the ideals for which he lived and worked are possible great sources of inspiration for the Indian Youth. He gave a speech at the Parliament of the World's Religions in Chicago and glorified India's name.

24 JANUARY 2022- National Girl Child Day



On 24 January annually, National Girl Child Day is celebrated to highlight the inequalities faced by a majority of the girls in India, the importance of education, nutrition, legal rights, medical care and safety of girl children, etc.

27 JANUARY 2022 International Day of Commemoration in Memory of the Victims of the Holocaust



Today marks the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp. Holocaust Memorial Day takes place annually. In the words of the Holocaust Memorial Day Trust, Holocaust Memorial Day encourages remembrance in a world scarred by genocide.

30 JANUARY 2022 - World Leprosy Eradication Day



French humanitarian Raoul Follereau chose World Leprosy Day in 1953 to coincide with the anniversary of Mahatma Ghandi's death on 30th January 1948. World Leprosy Day raises awareness of a disease that many people believe to be extinct. World Leprosy Day is observed on the last Sunday of January to focus on the target of zero cases of leprosy-related disabilities in children. As we know that disabilities do not occur overnight but happen after a prolonged period of undiagnosed disease.
